Respondents can select their preferred language when they start the survey. A shortened paper-version of the Parents and Carers Survey is also available in the following 5 languages: Dari, Dinka, Farsi, Karen and Mon. These surveys are available at the Front Office.

For the results to reflect the opinions of our whole school community, we need as many parents and carers, staff and students as possible to complete the survey. Your feedback is important, and we hope you will take part.

### Lockers

Lockers are available to students at a cost of \$30 per year. Students wanting to hire a locker will need to provide a lock with a shaft between 6-8mm. Key or combination locks are acceptable. Students need to bring their lock, payment and the spare key or the combination to the Finance Office before a locker will be allocated. Students can come to the Finance Office before school, at recess or the first half of lunch time.

### **FINANCE**

### INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES

### A message from the ACT Education Directorate: Keeping our students learning in Term 3

Every ACT public school is working hard to manage the impacts of COVID-19 and the flu in our schools to ensure minimal disruption for everyone and keep students learning.

Face-to-face learning in the classroom remains the core way students are learning this term; however, staff shortages may see them learning a little differently from time to time.

### What can parents and students expect?

When schools do not have appropriate staffing levels to support students in their usual classrooms the following measures may be put in place:

- Older students may learn online in a supervised setting.
- Students may be engaged in a modified program of learning in their regular classroom with supervision from school staff.
- Students may participate in self-directed learning (supervised by other classroom teachers this may be via Google Classrooms or a pre-prepared activity).
- Students may be split into classes across the school, where children may engage in self-directed learning and/or the learning of their host class.
- Some activities may be put on hold (eg lunchtime clubs)

Where schools are no longer able to manage using the above strategies students may move to learning from home for short periods of time.

If this is the case your school will work with the Directorate ahead of time to make this decision and families will be provided with learning activities for use during this time.

Sometimes this decision will need to be made quickly. We appreciate that the short notice is difficult for families and, where we can, will ensure we give as much notice as we are able.

Non-essential events and excursions

There may also be the need to postpone/cancel planned activities and events offsite (eg camps, excursions, sporting days etc) from time to time, sometimes at short notice.

We appreciate any cancellation is disappointing and wherever possible schools will reschedule these missed opportunities.

Thank you once more to our parents, carers and staff for their ongoing support and commitment again this term.



### OUTDOOR EDUCATION – CAVING

On the Thursday & Friday of last week of Term 2, some of our Outdoor Education students attended a caving excursion to Wee Jasper Caves NSW. Everyone arrived promptly, and with Elissa, Gemma and Hannah's help with the packing, we left Melrose High a little ahead of schedule.

The morale of the whole group was high for the whole camp. After setting up tents we hiked to Devil Punchbowl Gorge for abseiling activities, returning to camp mid-afternoon. After a rest and mid-afternoon lunch, we explored three wild caves, Enigma, Signature & Dog Leg caves. The students were enthusiastic, we looked at the cave formations and we had fun particularly in Signature cave, where staff challenged students to try specific caving movement skills. Returning to camp muddy and dirty we cleaned up to prepare our dinners on Trangia Stoves. Manaal & Atticus cooked up some delicious chicken curries for staff and other students. After dinner some students had fun with a spotlight game while others went with Ms Lewis to do some star gazing/discussions. Joshua Ford demonstrated how to identify star constellations



with a neat app. At around 9:00 pm students settled back to their tents for rest, and some talking before sleep.

On day two we had an early start to the day with breakfast then preparing for our vertical caving challenge exploration of Punchbowl cave. The entrance into the cave is a 25-metre pitch dark abseil. It was encouraging to see students overcome their fears to abseil into the cave. Due to some challenges, however, the decision to cease further exploration and exit the cave was made.

It was slow going, but students did very well. To support fatiguing students, we set-up a 5:1 ratio pulley system. Lachlan, Atticus, Banjo, Tyler and Asha were of huge assistance in helping in the hauling process. Although we did not get to fully explore the Punchbowl Cave the experience in dealing with getting everybody safely out of the cave was invaluable. Providing students with challenging opportunities to problem solve and to collaborate is one of the main objectives of Outdoor Education.

I would like to thank students and parents for their enthusiastic support for the excursion, Mrs Lewis for providing her professionalism and invaluable caving experience and Nathan Forato (Youth Support Worker) for his limitless assistance.

In Term 3 we move onto indoor & outdoor climbing with excursions being organised for Snake Rock Namadgi National Park, White Rocks Queanbeyan & Thompsons Wall Nowra NSW. In Term 4 we are planning a Canoe trip, perhaps to Tallowa Dam with Snorkelling at Jervis Bay.

### YEAR 7 SCIENCE FAIR!!!



### Melrose High drop-off point for Lids4Kids - NO LONGER A DROP-OFF POINT

Melrose High will no longer be a drop off location for Lids4Kids as the staff member running it is moving on. Lids4Kids Australia project was founded in May 2019 by Tim Miller, a Canberran full-time house Dad. 


### Lids4Kids ACT Mega Raffle – closes 30th August 2022

### **Recycling at Melrose**

This year we have taken a whole school approach to sorting the playground recycling bins before they are sent to the Materials Recycling Facilities (MRF) in Hume. Bins are sorted to remove non-recyclable items that are not accepted at the MRF, contamination items include food scraps, soft plastics, drinks with liquid still in them, tissues, disposable cutlery and face masks (photo shows the bottom contents of a contaminated recycling bag, gross!). This year, contamination accounts for 28% of the items in the bins, let's try reducing this to 20% by the end of the year. In Semester 2, Year 7 classes are sorting the recycling. Thank you to the students and teachers that have shown great enthusiasm and recycling rigor while sorting through the items! Over 2,200 items have been recycled, the equivalent to 16 household yellow recycling bins full! Let's keep the recycling high and contamination low! #RecycleRight







### **Op-Shop 'REVAMPED' at Melrose**

The second-hand clothing shop at Melrose is an ongoing community partnership with Koomarri since 2019. Koomarri kindly donate the items and the proceeds from the sales are given back to the not-for-profit organisation, allowing them to support people with disabilities in the community. Students can also be more conscious of their clothing choices and understand the negative impacts of fast fashion on the environment and wider society. Formal dresses and suits are priced \$5 to \$10, casual wear, shoes and accessories range from 50c to \$5. **To date, we have raised \$850 for Koomarri, such an amazing achievement!**
