Health and safety measures at school minimise the risk of COVID-19 transmission. By following these measures, we can all help keep school safe.



Schools will:

- > encourage eligible students, staff and families to get vaccinated
- > make sure all adults in schools use the Check In Canberra app
- > make sure staff are wearing masks
- > make sure staff follow physical distancing measures
- > limit the mingling of classes and year groups
- > stagger breaks
- > limit visitors
- > clean regularly
- > have a COVID-19 Safety Assurance Plan in place.



Students can help by:

- > always wearing a mask if they are in years 7 to 12
- > for those in years 3 to 6, wearing a mask if they want to (mask wearing for younger students is not recommended)
- > practising good hygiene and washing their hands regularly
- > following the advice from their teacher on keeping safe
- > staying at home if they are sick or feel unwell.
